SAMPLE STATION #4

Non-Interactive Station

TITLE: Checking Prepared Medications

OBJECTIVE:

• To check prepared medications and identify any corrections that must be made before the medications can be released.

COMPETENCIES TESTED:

Competency 3 Product Distribution

Elements 3.1 Dispense a product safely and accurately that is appropriate for the patient.

CANDIDATE INSTRUCTIONS:

Before you enter the station:

- Take <u>one</u> *Candidate Answer Sheet* from the red folder marked "For Candidates Only", on the wall outside the station. (Do NOT take anything from any other folder.)
- Attach one bar code label to the Candidate Answer Sheet in the space indicated.

When the start signal sounds:

- Enter the station and begin immediately.
- Find the prepared medications and corresponding written prescriptions on the desk / table.

Do the exercise:

PREPARED MEDICATIONS

There are **four** (4) PREPARED MEDICATIONS to be assessed.

- The corresponding written prescriptions are taped to the desk / table.
 - For each prescription, determine if it has been prepared correctly.
 - If it is correct, fill in the bubble beside "**NO** correction(s) required" on the answer sheet.
 - If any correction(s) are required, fill in the bubble beside "Specify **correction**(s)" and clearly write the **CORRECTION**(S) in the space provided on the answer sheet.
 - Some prepared medications may require more than one correction.
 - Assume the prescriptions were correctly written, and any drug therapy problems have been resolved.
 - Do NOT consider the omission of auxiliary labels.

Sample Answer Format:

Prescription 1

- **NO** correction(s) required.
- Specify correction(s): <u>Change label directions to 5 mL twice daily</u>

When the final signal sounds:

- Stop writing and erasing immediately.
- Turn your completed *Candidate Answer Sheet* over (answer side down) on the desk / table, to be collected by examination staff.
- Proceed to the next station, taking your pencils, notebook, and barcodes with you.

Time Frame: You have 7 minutes to complete this station.

Important:

- Do *not* physically correct the prepared medications.
- Do *not* mark the product labels or written prescriptions in any way.
- Do not write over any bubbles on the Candidate Answer Sheet as this renders the sheet invalid.

Sample Answer Format

- **NO** corrections required.
- Specify correction(s): <u>Change patient name on label to Veda Simmonds</u>

NOTE: An answer that states "*Wrong patient name*" would be incorrect as it does not specify the actual <u>correction</u>. (It only describes the <u>problem</u>.)
